



## **“New Moon Celebration”**

### **I. What to do on New Moon (Rosh Chodesh):**

#### **Numbers 28:11-15**

**Psalm 81:3,4** Blow the trumpets also at full moon; it is a statute  
**Full moon?** Greens Interlinear bible and NASB translates it full moon;  
King James translates it the **time appointed** which I think is correct. The  
strongs concordance leans towards time appointed; it says full moon but  
it's in italics. The AHLB doesn't have full moon at all only time  
appointed.\*note- could be a reference to Sukkot.

**Numbers 10:10** Blow the trumpets; a memorial to God on our behalf; a  
day of gladness, or time of rejoicing

**I Sam.20:24-27** – family gathering and festive meal; expected to be there

**Isaiah 66:22,23** – Worship and bow down to the Lord-we will keep it  
forever!

**Ezekiel 46:1-3** – Worship the Lord

There are a lot of offerings mentioned at the time of the new month or new  
moon. We don't do these sacrifices without a temple system in place. But  
there is something you can offer to the Lord which is more important than  
any sacrifice you could ever make.

**Mark 6:30-44;** There is something special about putting something into  
the hands of God for Him to work with. They needed a miracle to feed all  
these people and in order for Yeshua to do the miracle He asked that they  
put something in His hands to work with.

Now we can put something in Gods hands to work with. We can give Him our hearts, our time, our resources, we can be His hands and feet, His voice crying in this world to repent and turn to God.

**Vs.52** – Don't let your heart become hardened. Ask God for a soft, pliable heart that will desire to please Him; ask God for a heart after His own heart.
